Understanding Changes to the 2015 National Building Code

In November 2016, the Government of the Northwest Territories adopted the 2015 National Building Code and National Fire Code.

To help code users understand the code provisions, the Northwest Territories Architect Association, in collaboration with the National Research Council of Canada (NRC), is offering seminars on major technical changes in these documents. The seminars are designed to help code users familiarize themselves with the new code features and technical updates. They will address major changes including:
